

Annual Report Fiscal Year 2022-2023

Board meetings are held on the third Saturday of each month at the Hope Brown Center, Farnham Farm.

The public is invited to attend and comment. At present, the Board is implementing projects to improve the quantity and quality of our water. Your opinions and suggestions enhance the discussion.

2023 Election

2023 was an election year. Gloria Antaya was elected to the Board, replacing Phil Brooks.

System Improvements

The Rhode Island Department of Health has given its preliminary approval for a treatment facility that should improve the coliform, iron, and manganese water quality issues. H2Olson Engineering has put the project out to bid, and the PIWD is seeking funding from Rhode Island Infrastructure Bank (RIIB). The Board thanks you for your continued patience.

The PIWD completed the Governor Paine pipeline replacement project and will begin

Bristol Colony in the coming year. These line replacement projects are primarily funded by Congressionally Directed Spending grants.

The PIWD continues work on overall system reliability. Upgrades to the Broadway booster station are in progress, with a focus on emergency power. Longer term, the PIWD continues its search for new water sources.

The PIWD retired its old, white truck and is in the process of obtaining a replacement.

New Hires

As the PIWD is currently operating with minimal coverage, we continue to seek a part-time operator and manager to assist.

Cross Connection Control Surveys

The PIWD is required by the state to complete Cross Connection Control Surveys on all customer properties. With the help of RIRWA, 149 inspections were completed in 2023. If you haven't been inspected, you can expect to hear from us soon.

Also, PIWD will be adding, removing, and replacing backflow preventers installed at curb stops many years ago. This work may disrupt individual customer service lines.
